

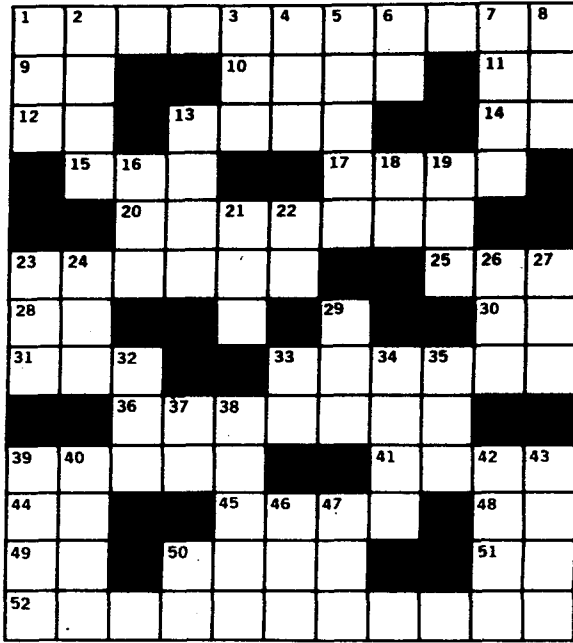

Soap opera addicts converge

CLEVELAND (Reuter) — Incurable addicts of television soap operas are flocking to a place called the Love In The Afternoon Club for group therapy.

The group therapy is really a matter of addicts taking their medicine collectively — that is, watching the soap serials together on a big TV screen every weekday afternoon.

They can let their emotions run away with them as they get caught up in the heart-wrenching TV dramas that end each day with a crisis and have viewers anxiously awaiting the next episode.

"It's much more fun to watch the soaps with other people instead of sitting alone in your home," says the club's founder, Mary Ellen Sullivan, a 30-year-old Cleveland restaurant manager.

"You get together with others you find are just as devoted to the soaps as you are. You can share your emotions with other people who feel the same way. You don't have to be embarrassed about getting emotionally involved.

"You can talk about the characters, about what might happen tomorrow. That's what the club is all about."

Miss Sullivan opened the club a month ago in Peabody's restaurant in Cleveland Heights, a middle-class suburb.

"The response was just fantastic," she said. "Membership has gone from zero to 125 in just four weeks."

Miss Sullivan is thinking of opening Love in the Afternoon clubs in other cities where the soaps have a big following.

She said the notion that only bored housewives watch the soaps is nonsense.
