Load/Save Submenu

Load

Loads selected file type into memory at target cell.

Wrksheet

Loads selected worksheet file into memory at target cell.

Data

Loads the selected DIF file into memory.

Path OK

Loads file from the current path (listed at top left of

screen).

New Path

Allows the loading from different volumes and subdirectories than those in the current path.

Save

Saves current worksheet to the specified file type.

Wrksheet

Saves range of cells to a worksheet file.

Data

Saves range of cells into a DIF file.

Text

Saves cell range to a text (ASCII) file.

Rename

Renames old file names to new file names. Rename options are:

Wrksheet Data Text

Quit

Quits the SynCalc program. Allows you to select other system programs to run. For advanced ProDOS users only.

Format

Formats data diskettes using the ProDOS

Delete

Deletes selected file from disk. Delete

Text Entry Window

Enter or edit any text entry. The small vertical mark at the top of the window indicates the last cursor position on the current column.

Numeric Entry Window

Edit or enter any numeric or formula entry. A solid cursor indicates cell point mode, while a blinking cursor indicates cell edit mode. Pressing CONTROL -S will toggle between the two modes. Pressing the closed-apple key will display a function reference screen (in 40 column mode, the key must be pressed twice to display all the functions).

Special Characters

The following characters have special meaning to SynCalc:

Specifies the entire worksheet.
Specifies the lower right cell of your worksheet.

Cursor Control Keys

Arrow keys Moves the cursor one cell at a time in the desired direction.

Open-apple + Moves the cursor in the desired direction a page at a time.

CONTROL -B * Moves the cursor immediately to the beginning of the worksheet.

CONTROL -E Moves the cursor immediately to the lower left cell entry (end of worksheet).

CONTROL -S Toggles between windows.

While Editing a Cell

CONTROL -C Clears window.

CONTROL -D Deletes character.

CONTROL -F Inserts a space forward.

DELETE Deletes one character to the left.

TAB Moves the cursor one tab to the right.

CONTROL -R Reverse tab. Moves the cursor one tab to the left.

While Editing a Numeric Cell

CONTROL -S Toggles between cell point mode (solid cursor) and cell edit mode (blinking

cursor).

Closed-apple key Puts a list of SynCalc functions in window at bottom of screen.

While Editing a Text Cell

CONTROL -P Allows entry of printer control codes as decimal numbers (0-255) in a text cell.
